OUR FAVORITE HIKES

This was vividly brought to our atten-
 tion, when two of three requests indicated
 that this sort of problem exists.

Therefore, this issue we are printing a
 map showing the location of each of "OUR
 FAVORITE HIKES" todate, to go with the
 index.

CODES FOR THE HIKES

- A - Easy - Hikes up to six miles, with
 very little hill climbing.
 [Excellent for beginners]
- B - Fairly easy - Hikes up to six miles, with some
 climbing. [Good for beginners]
- B+ - Moderate - Hikes up to six miles, with more
 difficult climbs.
- C - Fairly moderate - Hikes of 7 to 9 miles, with
 very little climbing.
- C+ - Strenuous - Hikes of 7 to 9 miles, with
 several significant climbs.
- D - More strenuous - Hikes of 10 to 12 miles, with
 very little climbing.
- D+ - Very strenuous - Hikes of 10 to 12 miles, with
 several significant climbs.
- E - Difficult - Hikes of over 12 miles.
- E+ - Very difficult - Hikes of over 12 miles on very
 rugged terrain.

In addition, the leader(s) should describe the pace
 and footing, where this is essential, such as: Easy
 with moderate or fast pace; or, Easy with nature
 study stops; or, Good footpath; or, Rocky and rough;
 etc.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

This BUSHWACK BULLETIN has our Spring quarter hike schedule in it and no doubt many of our members will be yearning for spring weather when they receive this issue. As I am writing this, it's only mid-January but it seems like we've already had a full winter thrown at us, including the Blizzard of '96. Some of our winter schedule of hikes have been cancelled and our quarterly meeting postponed due to the harsh weather.

But, joyously, spring will eventually arrive and with it another glorious hiking season! But, with the urge to get out and hike will also come the responsibility to get out and clear our trails of winter blowdowns and debris. The rough winter weather can play havoc on our trails and facilities.

Everyone of us that hike and enjoy the trails must also recognize our responsibility to care for and manage those same trails. Although individuals alone can have a positive impact on trail maintenance and clearing, more work can be accomplished by a group and done within standards adopted by trail organizations such as ours, through schedule trail maintenance trips.

Speaking of trail maintenance, our Club will be purchasing a gas powered brush cutter soon with grant money from the Appalachian Trail Conference. It will be used in our Club's regulary scheduled trail maintenance trips and could be used by properly trained individuals on other hiking trails in our area.

If you are one that likes to explore new trails and terrain, you might want to get in touch with Club member Tom Scully who is helping out on a new series of Appalachian Trail maps for the Keystone Trails Association. The first of the new maps will cover the A.T. from the Susquehanna River to Swatara Gap. This of course includes our section of the A.T. and many of our favorite hiking trails in nearby State Game Lands. The new maps will cover a broader area than the old maps and Tom wants to include as many hikeable trails and old roads as can be found, but he needs volunteers to help out in scouting the large area to be covered on the new map.

If you are one that likes to hike fast and/or long distances, you might want to start training for a marathon hike to be sponsored by our Club this April.

The approximately 33 mile hike will cover the A.T. and several other trails in the State Game Lands north of Harrisburg. Club member Gail Guers will be coordinating this event and will need help in planning the hike and will need volunteers on the day of the hike to man check points and other duties.

Finally, the board discussed the possibility of S.A.T.C. going "on line" at our last quarterly board meeting. In the computer world that means the placement of an information page or "HOME PAGE" about our Club on the Internet. The Internet is a group of computers throughout the world that are tied together by phone lines and is increasing in size daily.

The BUSHWACK BULLETIN is a very important function of our Club, since it is the link whereby we communicate with our members.

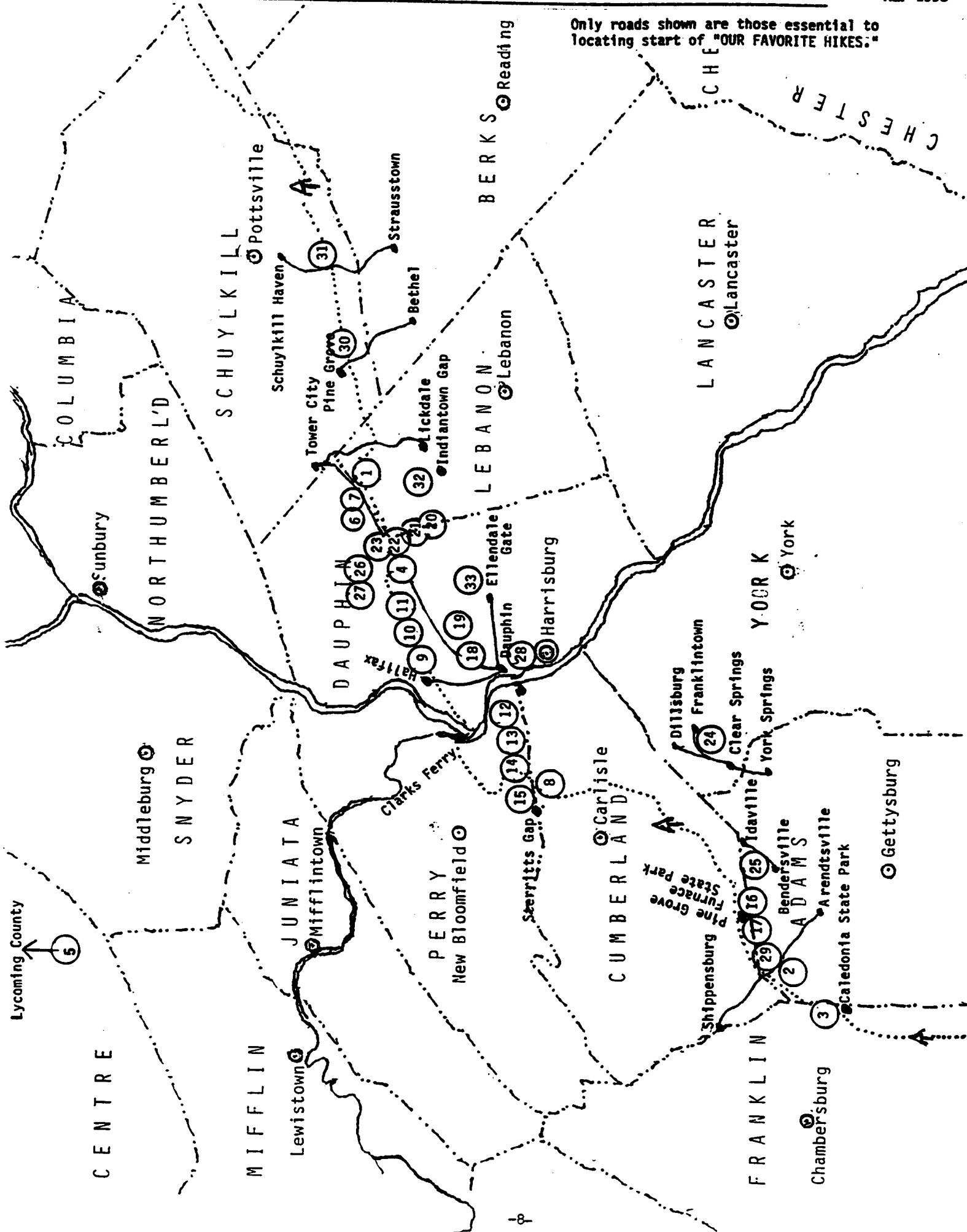

REPORT OF THE NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The ANNUAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS is held at the Annual Dinner Meeting. The Annual Dinner, this year, is scheduled for Saturday, March 18, 1989. See announcement in this issue of the BUSHWACK BULLETIN.

The BY-LAWS of the Club provide for the election as follows:

BY-LAW I - ELECTION AND QUALIFICATION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS:

Section 1 - NOMINATIONS: The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee, which shall be chaired by a non-officer member of the Board of Directors, not later than sixty [60] days before the next succeeding Annual Meeting. The Nominating Committee shall notify all Club Members at least thirty [30] days before the Annual Meeting of the nominated persons. The Nominating Committee is limited to one nomination for each office and non-officer directorship. Additional nominations, which are reserved to the membership at large, may be submitted in writing to the Nominating Committee, until one week prior to the Annual Meeting. No nominations are to be made nor accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting.

Section 2 - ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND NON-OFFICER DIRECTORS: Election shall be at the Annual Meeting. If there are more than one nominee for any office or non-officer directorship, the election shall be by secret ballot and by plurality vote.

Section 3 - TERM OF OFFICE: Officers shall be elected annually, but the President and Vice-President shall in no event serve more than two consecutive terms in their respective offices. The Secretary and Treasurer may serve successive one year terms without limitation. Non-officer members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by class to serve a two year term, but they shall in no event serve more than two consecutive elected terms.
