

Minutes of the July 10 2018 SATC Board Meeting

Present were Dawn Warden, Tim Younces, Jim Stickney, Mark Press, Gail Brossman, Rob Shaw, Kevin Dunleavy, Gary Labelle, Jane Tuckey, and Cindy Radich

The minutes from the April 10, 2018 meeting were approved.

The Treasurer, Gary Labelle, reported the sales tax exemption application is due by November 2018.

The Hospitality Chair, Dawn Warden, reported the trail-maintainer picnic was a success with about 12 people attending. It was decided to buy barbeque again for this year's membership picnic.

The President, Gail Brossman, reported on membership activity. About 20 people renewed membership based on the emails sent out by Nancy Kurtz. Nancy is also planning to mail reminders to those who don't have email. The club currently has about 370 paid members. In response to an invitation to the club from the King's Gap Environmental Education and Training Center, Gail will attend an open house event at King's Gap on July 20th, and she will be providing information to the public about the club during the event as part of the club's publicity effort.

A response to Trailmaster Jeff Buehler's request in his written report about the continued purchase of the Elephant Snot graffiti removal product was discussed. It was decided to ask Jeff to contact Bob Sickley about obtaining an alternate product. The Trailmaster can buy either product up to the dollar amount listed in the budget

A response to Cindy Radich's recommendation in her Web Site written report that the club employ a website designer/programmer to assist with the "new" website was discussed. It was decided to: 1) continue using the existing website for now, 2) the Vice President, Tim Younces, will investigate the cost and usability of having the club's existing website replaced by one sourced from a website provider company, and 3) the Secretary, Mark Press, will attend an HTML course with the intention of evaluating if the club can maintain the "new" and existing websites without outside support.

The club's paver is installed in the ATC garden in Harpers Ferry and it will be dedicated on July 21.
